Frequently Asked Questions

How should I prepare for my appointment and what can I expect?

To make your experience as comfortable as possible:

- Do not wear any deodorant, lotion, or cream around your chest area the day of your appointment.
- On the day of your appointment, wear a twopiece outfit, so you only need to remove your top. We will provide a gown for you to wear during the screening.
- The mobile mammography unit is a spacious coach with two changing rooms for your privacy.

How long will it take to get results and who can I talk to about them? A radiologist will provide a report after your mammogram. If you are enrolled in MyTowerHealth patient portal, your results will be available in the platform as soon as the report is completed. If you are not enrolled in MyTowerHealth, you will receive a letter from Reading Hospital with your results within two weeks. If you do not receive your mammogram letter, please contact Reading Hospital Imaging at Spring Ridge Breast Health Center: 484-628-3108. What if my results are abnormal? Reading Hospital will follow up with you and your provider to schedule further testing. There are many reasons why mammograms are abnormal. In fact, the American College of Radiology estimates that only 1 in 10 patients called back for additional testing are found to have cancer.

Will my breast screening be as accurate as one I would get in a doctor's office or imaging center? Yes. Our Mobile Mammography Coach has the same professional staff and state-of-theart technology found at any Reading Hospital Screening Mammography Imaging Center. Our highly-trained and experienced radiologists will review your scan.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why do I need a mammogram?

A mammogram is the best screening tool for early detection of breast cancer. One in eight women will develop breast cancer in her lifetime, and most don't have a family history of the disease. The American College of Radiology recommends that all women get their first mammogram at the age of 40.

Can anyone get a breast screening at the Mobile Mammography Coach?

To qualify, you must be:

- Must be at least 40 years old.
- At least 365 days must have passed since the individual's last mammogram.
- An order is required from a provider.

If you are experiencing any concerning symptoms, such as a lump, please contact your physician immediately as you might need a diagnostic mammogram.

Do I need to schedule an appointment?

Yes. To schedule an appointment, call **484-628-8611.** Have your health insurance policy number and your provider's contact information handy.

What should I bring to my appointment?

Please bring your insurance cards and photo ID.

Will my insurance pay for my screening?

Preventive screenings are covered under most insurance plans.
